When I heard about this program several months ago, I initiated the proposal so that seniors who come to Jenkins Place can take advantage of this life-enriching opportunity.

I'm also happy to see that many seniors who come to Jenkins Place are expressing interest in supporting other City events. It was great to have several seniors at our booth during First Fridays to share information about all the great things taking place at Jenkins Place. In the future, I hope to see a lot more senior participation in City events, including our First Police Appreciation Day on August 16, where lunch will be served.

I invite everyone to always share their thoughts and ideas with me concerning programs and senior involvement with all things Olmsted Falls. We treasure you and your input!

### **GREEN TIP OF THE MONTH - AUGUST - 2018**

The next time you're asked "paper or plastic?" answer "Neither!"

Paper – Americans use 10 billion paper bags a year. To make the heavy paper for bags requires virgin pulp for living forest. The more trees we cut down, the more CO2 is released into the atmosphere and the fewer trees left standing to absorb all the CO2.



Plastic – The amount of petroleum (oil) used to make 14 plastic bags is equivalent to what it would take to drive a car one mile. 100 billion plastic bags are thrown out every year wasting enough oil to drive 47,619 cars for a year.

Neither! Take your own reusable bags to the store. If you forget or don't have any, purchase some that most stores offer at a reasonable price, and leave bags in your trunk.



In her office or in the home setting, she is able to diagnose and treat common illnesses/ailments, prescribe/adjust/refill your prescriptions, manage/order laboratory work and other diagnostic testing, X-rays, ultrasounds, and lab collection, monitor the status of any chronic conditions, Order skilled nursing visits or Physical/Occupational Therapy, and write prescriptions for durable medical equipment.

Visits are billed to your Medicare/Insurance/Medicaid in the same manner as any provider office visit. Her office hours at the Jenkins Center will be noted on the calendar, however "as needed" visits can be easily scheduled.
